#### **PURPOSE & KEY POINTS**

The purpose of this item is to review and discuss the 2022-23 committee work plan.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Board of Regents Policy: Board Operations and Agenda Guidelines describes the role of the Governance & Policy Committee as follows:

The Governance & Policy Committee (GOV) oversees and makes recommendations to the Board related to policy and processes that seek to ensure the integrity and high performance of the Board. The committee supports effective governance by guiding the Board to: articulate a clear vision for the University and its major components; clarify reserved and delegated authorities; establish institutional benchmarks and performance measures; and thoughtfully considers risks that may impact the performance of the institution.

Specifically, this committee recommends to the Board:

- amendments to the Bylaws and changes to the structure and function of the Board;
- amendments to Board policies not routed through one of the other standing committees: and
- consideration of other University policy matters referred to the committee by the Board chair.

This committee provides oversight to:

- evaluate the effectiveness of the Board through periodic self-assessment;
- ensure that Regents are fully oriented and receive ongoing education; and
- identify best practices in governance for possible implementation.

#### **PURPOSE & KEY POINTS**

This discussion in September will shape future committee discussions about how the Board approaches public engagement, and how the Office of the Board of Regents can support the Board in this work.

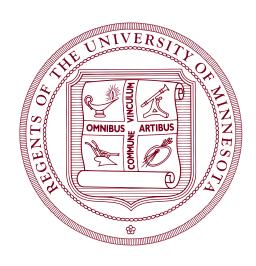

- Acts in best interest of institution

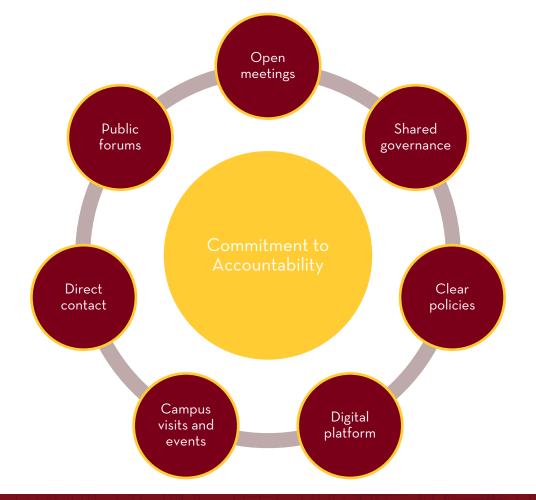
#### Representative

- Shorter-term responsiveness
- Carries voices of others into debate
- Acts as advocate

### Commitment to Accountability

[B]oard accountability has a public dimension to it. Boards need to behave in ways that make sure that the public trusts them and they are doing their collective best to move the institution or state system forward. # Public Transparency and "Engagement"

- The Board engages the University community and public through:
  - transparently sharing Board decisions and discussions
  - collecting input and consulting on matters before the Board



### **Open Meeting Law Requirements**

- Provide notice of meetings
- Open meetings to the public
- Keep a record of actions taken by the Board (minutes)
- Make relevant materials (i.e., agendas and dockets) available to the public

#### **Shared Governance**

- Provides opportunities for diverse voices of the University community to participate in discussions and consult on key issues facing the University.
  - University Senate considered one of the strongest in the nation
  - Student Representatives charged with bringing the student voice to the Board
  - Board policy review process significant consultation across
     University community

### Going Beyond the Basics

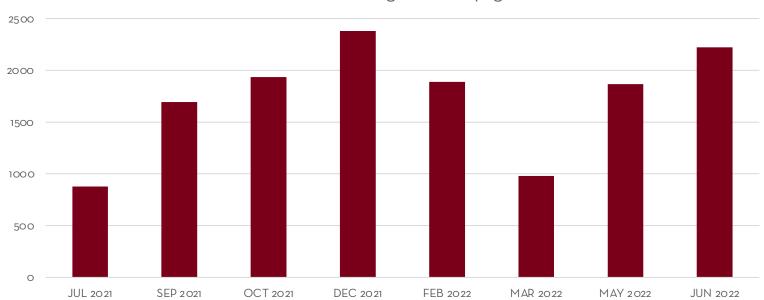
- Live stream and video recording of all Board and committee meetings.

- Detailed press releases
  - One week before meeting, and right after the meeting

### Going Beyond the Basics

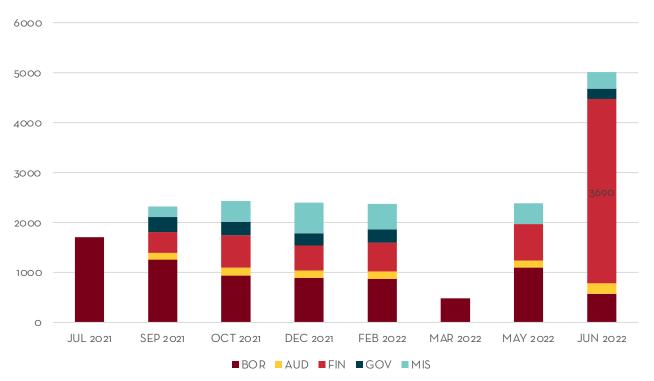
- System campus meetings

- Shared governance
- Website contact form
- Casual interaction with the University community

## **Public Forum Opportunities**

- Required in statute or policy
  - Traffic ordinances
  - Body-worn cameras
- Annual Operating Budget
  - Traditional in-person public forum (15 speakers)
  - Written comment opportunity (60+ written comments, on average); comments shared publicly via docket
  - Widely promoted to the University community

### Request to Address the Board

- Board's Bylaws:
  - "A request to appear before a meeting of the Board of Regents or its standing or special committees shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary, in advance of the meeting. The Chair shall rule on all requests. If the request is to appear before a committee, the Chair may also consult with the Committee Chair."
